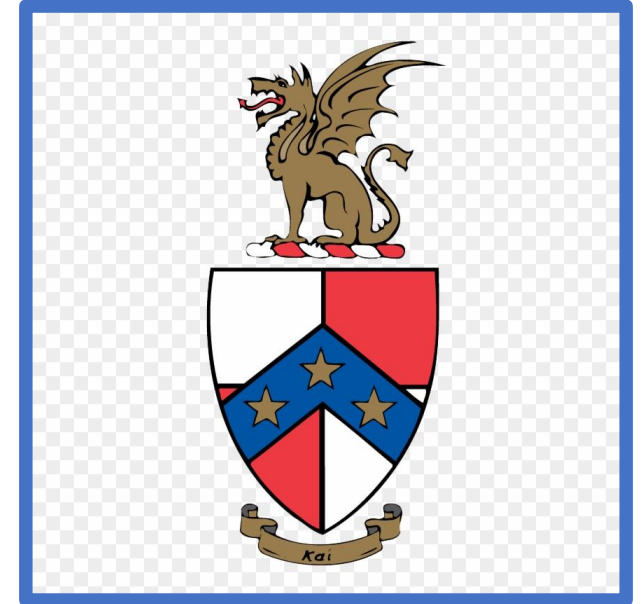


Beta Theta Pi Foundation – Board of Directors
