

Peer Visit Program update

AILG Plenary 16 February, 2023

- 6 groups visited so far (Delta Tau Delta, Theta Chi, Phi Kappa Theta, Sigma Nu, PIKA, Nu Delta)
- Feedback is positive and we are adjusting the process based on experiences and comments received
 - Pros: constructive and friendly atmosphere, helpful advice
 - Cons: volunteer recruitment, scheduling and process logistics
- We will be scheduling more visits this term and are seeking visiting team members
 - 3 members per visiting team, 2 houses in a day
 - Target 6 teams, ideally 18 volunteers
 - Time commitment: 10a-4p on a weekend day, plus reviewing the materials pre/post review, total of about 8 hours
 - No experience necessary! Great role for young alums
 - No need to be local, you can Zoom in remotely
- Our experience is that the visits are particularly valuable for the visiting team members
- Plan to review 25% of groups each term, each group every two years
- Output for the AILG community:
 - Best practices
 - Resources (eg lawyers, accountants, electricians...)
 - Questions / requests for help or expertise
- Output for the group:
 - Questions the AILG might help address
 - Advice, referrals, shared experiences
