AILG Information Technology Committee: FY2023 Report

Academic Year 2022-2023 Accomplishments:

- -All alumni-operated FSILGs signed and continued to operate with the terms with version 5.0 of the Network Management Program Agreement.
- All network inspection fees of \$400 per year will be rebated this year because inspections were scheduled without undue delay.
- The annual fee will stay at \$2,100 for next year. Because inspection compliance has been excellent no inspection fees will initially be assessed next year.
- Only a few outages were experienced, well in excess of 99.9% uptime for backbone.
- Annual fee stays at \$2,100 for next year. Because inspection compliance has been excellent no inspection fees will initially be assessed next year.
- IS&T is in year 2 of a the 5-year agreement with our fiber optic cable supplier, Crown Castle.

Charter:

- Collaborate with MIT's IS&T (Information Systems and Technology) department to construct and maintain reliable network infrastructure and IT support services for FSILG residences.
- Maintain platform for the AILG web site (ailg.mit.edu) and AILG mailing lists.
- Provide optional services such as environmental monitoring & <u>VOIP telephony</u> to FSILG houses.

Continuing Responsibilities:

- Keep FSILGs informed of IS&T support available (e.g. Help Desk, FCI communications)
- Maintain world-class infrastructure as demands increase
- Plan for periodic equipment infrastructure upgrades (e.g. routers, wireless access points)
- Make new services available and supportable (e.g. Zoom)
- Support AILG's web site and mailing lists
- Find new members for the AILG IT committee!
